The BISA South East Europe Working Group invites applications for an online explorative workshop:

Worlding from South East Europe, Remaking International Relations

The discipline of International Relations is often described as Eurocentric and has been negligent of standpoints outside the Global North and the West. Scholars of South East Europe (SEE) have responded to this problem in a myriad of ways: by highlighting the contributions and developments of the discipline in the region; challenging the ways that foundational concepts like Europeanisation and justice are understood from the vantage point of SEE; and excavating the ways in which the region has been (mis)used in the discipline.

In this workshop, we aim to build on this critical scholarship by highlighting methodologically, conceptually, and topically innovative interventions that engage in what is traditionally understood as area studies. To that end, we invite contributions that aim to rethink International Relations in and from SEE, broadly understood. Themes may include, but are not limited to:

- International thought in SEE
- Arts, creativity, (pop) culture, and visual politics in SEE
- Nature-human relations, political ecologies, and environmental movements and politics
- Constructing and understanding Europe and whiteness
- Russia and China in SEE

The workshop will continue to build collaborative networks within and beyond the Working Group. The workshop format will be based on presentations of **extended abstracts**, enabling discussion of research at different stages. After the workshop, we envision the discussions to continue at BISA 2023 and encourage authors to submit their paper abstracts for consideration at the annual conference. In the longer term, we plan an in-person workshop to support work toward publication.
